It will focus on new trends in cultural measurement practice seeking to challenge existing ways of thinking, and explore the potential of cultural indicators on contemporary governance and public policy. Participants from around the world will engage in a critical dialogue on various approaches to monitoring, evaluating, planning, advocating, predicting, and simply understanding cultural change.
